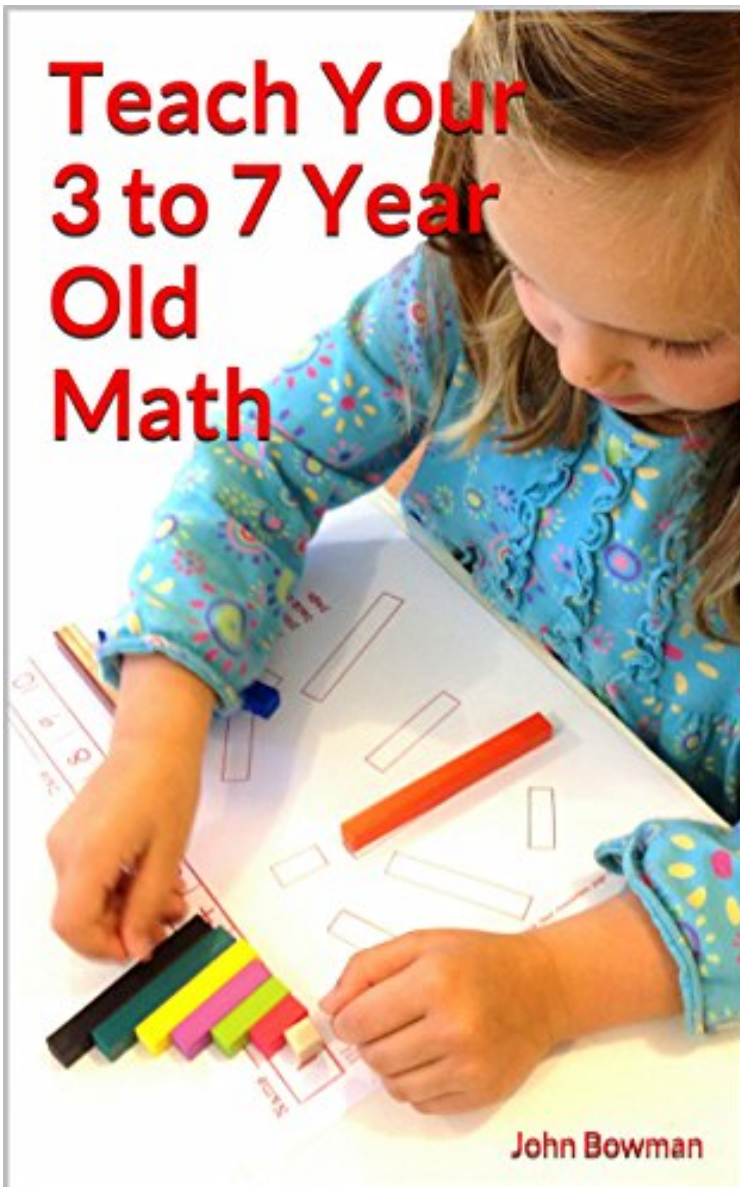


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Teach Your 3 to 7 Year Old Math (English Edition)
